

The St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWMD) was created by the Florida Legislature in 1972 to be one of five water management districts in Florida. It includes all or part of 18 counties in northeast Florida. The mission of SJRWMD is to ensure the sustainable use and protection of water resources for the benefit of the people of the District and the state of Florida. SJRWMD accomplishes its mission through regulation; applied research; assistance to federal, state, and local governments; operation and maintenance of water control works; and land acquisition and management.

THIRD ADDENDUM MAY 13, 2008

The St. Johns River Water Management District (SJRWMD) approved its *District Water Supply Plan 2005* (*DWSP 2005*) on February 7, 2006. *DWSP 2005* has been published by SJRWMD as Technical Publication SJ2006-2. The SJRWMD Governing Board approved an addendum (first addendum) to *DWSP 2005* on October 10, 2006. A second addendum to *DWSP 2005* was approved on December 11, 2007. This third addendum to *DWSP 2005* is important because the revised information contained within tables is (1) directly linked to the water supply entity notification process, which is required pursuant to Section 373.0361, *Florida Statutes*; (2) required for SJRWMD's Water Protection and Sustainability Program; and (3) essential in SJRWMD's efforts to develop technical assistance documents for local governments to use in updating their comprehensive plans to address water supply issues, including the identification of alternative and traditional water supply projects necessary for meeting the water supply needs within their jurisdictions. Following are enumerated changes to *DWSP 2005* associated with this third addendum.

Water supply development projects: Amend the list of water supply development projects, beginning on page vi of the Executive Summary in *DWSP 2005*, to include 24 newly identified projects (project numbers 61 to 84 as shown on List 1, attached).

Figure 5. Multijurisdictional water supply development projects 2005. As presented in this addendum, Figure 5 includes 12 additional project locations. These locations are for project numbers 61, 64, 65, 66, 67, 69, 71, 72, 74, 77, 78, and 79. Also, water supply development project number 40 was added to the multijurisdictional water supply development projects list from the single-entity water supply projects list. Figure 5, as it is included in this addendum, supersedes Figure 5 in *DWSP 2005* and the first addendum to *DWSP 2005*.

Figure 6. Single-entity water supply development projects 2005. As presented in this addendum, Figure 6 includes eight additional project locations. These locations are for project numbers 62, 63, 68, 70, 73, 75, 76, 80, 81, 82, 83, and 84. Also, water supply project number 40 was removed from the single-entity water supply development projects list and added to the multijurisdictional water supply development projects list. Figure 6, as it is included in this addendum, supersedes Figure 6 in *DWSP 2005* and the first addendum to *DWSP 2005*.

Table 13. Quantities and estimated costs of alternative water supply development projects. As presented in this third addendum to *DWSP 2005*, Table 13 is expanded to include the addition

of 24 new water supply development projects identified through the water supply entity notification process, county-level water supply planning processes, and other SJRWMD efforts. Table 13, as it is included in this addendum, supersedes Table 13 in *DWSP 2005* and in the first and second addenda to *DWSP 2005*.

Table 14. SJRWMD—Public water supply entities and associated alternative water supply development projects. As presented in this addendum, Table 14 includes the addition of new water supply development projects associated with water supply entities. Table 14, as it is included in this addendum, supersedes Table 14 in *DWSP 2005* and in the first and second addenda to *DWSP 2005*.

As presented in this addendum, Table 15 includes a DWSP project number for each project, the addition of 12 multijurisdictional and 12 single-entity water supply development projects with descriptions of associated status, project sponsors, and funding sources. 
